GETTING AROUND NOT-IN-BEANTOWN

We will be walking between stops on this pub crawl - other than getting to the starting point and getting home when you are finished, no public transportation will be needed. It is highly recommended that you **do not drive** at any point during or after this crawl, not only because of the intoxicating nature of the event, but also because it is darn near impossible to park anywhere near most of the bars. **Please, please, please don't drink and drive.** We want this to be a safe and enjoyable crawl. If you live outside Boston, find a local hotel or motel to stay in or bribe a Wort (free beer is usually effective) who lives in the area and crash at their place overnight. And although we always plan on sunny days, you should watch the forecast. This tour will be held no matter what the weather, so dress accordingly.

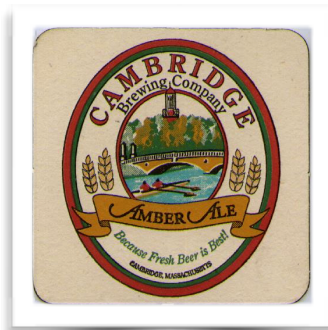

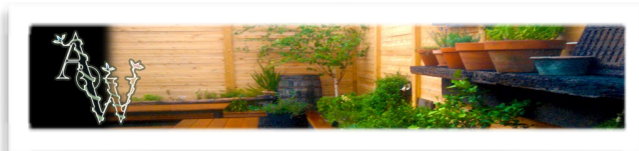

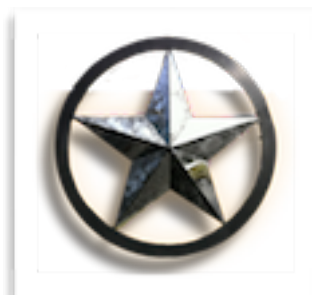

HOW TO GET THERE

You know where this place is, right? But just in case: **One Kendall Square** is the cluster of red brick buildings at the corner of Hampshire and Cardinal Medeiros Avenue in Cambridge. As you enter the courtyard, the CBC is immediately ahead on your left.

Turn **left** out of the CBC into the alley, then turn **left** and walk out to Cardinal Medeiros Ave. Turn **right** and walk many blocks (~7?) to a stop sign at Cambridge St. Cross the street and turn **left**. Atwood's is ~3 blocks ahead on your right @ **877 Cambridge Street**.

Turn **left** out of Atwood's and walk down Cambridge Street towards Boston. Cross the railroad tracks and Lone Star Tacos is ~ 1 block ahead on your left at **635 Cambridge Street** (corner of Cambridge and Lambert).

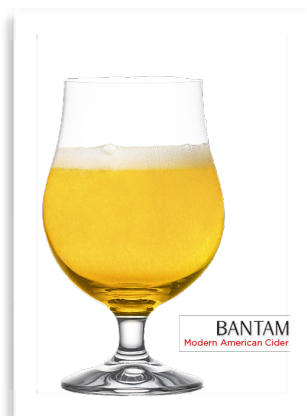

Somerville's very own cider producer located on the edge of Union Square. The production facility includes a 1,300-square-foot taproom that features many specialty small-batch releases to try, along with their standard lineup of ciders.



HOW TO GET THERE

Turn **right** out of Lone Star and take an immediate **right** onto Lambert Street. Walk to the end of the block and at the lights turn **left** onto Medford Street. Follow Medford Street as it bends around to the right, crossing the railroad tracks and taking the third **left** onto Ward Street. American Fresh is just ahead on the **left** at 15 Ward Street.

Leaving American Fresh, turn **right** onto Ward, then take a **left** onto Medford Street. Walk under the railroad bridge and, as soon as you are able, turn **left** into the Target parking lot. Keeping Target on your immediate **left**, walk to the far side of the lot (Advance Auto will be on your right) and take a **right** onto Merriam Street. Bantam cider is almost immediately on the left at **#40 Merriam Street**.

Exit Bantam Cider and turn **left** onto Merriam. Go to the end of the block and turn **left** onto Somerville Ave. Walk several blocks to a stoplight at Prospect Street. Cross the street and turn **right** onto Prospect, then turn **left** almost immediately into the parking area that is Washington Street. Bronwyn is just ahead on your **right** at 255 Washington Street.

As you fall out of Bronwyn's front door, aim slightly to the **right** and fall across the alley (watch out for vehicles!) - The Independent is directly in front of you.
